### INTERNSHIP DESCRIPTIONS

**Marine Mammal and Sea Turtle Rescue Team** - Interns assist staff biologists and program volunteers with all response, treatments and releases of stranded marine mammals & sea turtles found within New York State. Specific duties include: all preparation and delivery of food to animals receiving care, enclosure cleaning and maintenance, facility cleaning and maintenance, water quality testing, assistance with medical and husbandry treatments (blood analysis, data entry) and general tank repairs and maintenance. Interns will assist the research program staff and volunteers with selected research projects including; marine mammal and sea turtle post release tagging.

**Education** – Interns will assist the education staff and volunteer docents with educational programs such as lectures, tours, beach cleanups, mock strandings, seal cruises and more. Interns will provide information on the research, conservation, and rescue programs while promoting stewardship and public awareness of the marine environment. In addition, they will assist in the development and design of educational programs, PowerPoint presentations and new interactive, informative displays and exhibits for the rescue center.

**Operations/Marketing** - Interns will assist in the development and operations of the New York Marine Rescue Center. Tasks will include; working with local business owners, assisting and organizing fundraising events, fielding general questions from the public and helping with daily tasks. Interns will also assist in the promotion of NYMRC through applications of social media. Applicants must be experienced in social media and able to use the following: Instagram, Facebook etc.

**Research Projects** – Research opportunities are available for college students interning for course credits. Projects must be approved by senior staff members and must line up with the mission of the NYMRC. Students who are interested in research work here at the facility must also have a faculty advisor on board from their current college or university.
